Punderson Golf Course hosts stop on NCJT

The North Coast Junior Tour continued play at Punderson Golf Course. Nick Palladino of Highland Heights won the boys 16-19 age group.

Palladino shot a 38 on the front nine and a 37 on the back, finishing with a 75, one stroke ahead of Dennis Holub of Reminderville.

Josh Rapkin of Orange and

William Reitan of Chagrin Falls were part of a five-way tie for third. They both shot a 78.

Tied in eighth was Christian Wagner of Chagrin Falls and Holden Pahr of Chardon. They both carded 80s.

Doug Revak of Chagrin Falls was tied in 10th with an 81, along with Conor McKiernan of Willoughby Hills.

In the boys 14-15 age group, Clay Holizna of Russell was part of a three-way tie in fifth with an 82. Right behind Holizna was Ari Slifstein of Orange with an 84, then Adam Rukin of Pepper Pike with an 85 and Jack Coyne of University Heights with an 86 in 10th.

Jackson Stroup of Hudson won the 14-15 age group with

a 73, one stroke ahead of Tyler McHugh of Macedonia.

In the youngest age group, boys 12-13, Bowe Andrews of Chagrin Falls was the top golfer. He shot an 82, which was two shots ahead of Alexander Torres of Cleveland. Will Widman of Chagrin Falls carded an 89, which was good for fifth.

In the girls' 16-19 age

group, friendly rivals Brynn FitzGerald and Nicki Henry went at it again. This time, FitzGerald came out on top, shooting a 74 to beat Henry by five strokes. FitzGerald's 36 on the back nine was the only sub-40 score other than Henry's 39 on the front nine. Mackenzie Alexander of Chesterland was seventh with a 94.

Solon's Katie Basch came in

fifth in the girls 12-15 age group. She shot an 88. Kelly Poe of Chagrin Falls was eighth with a 97 and Sara Holabaugh of Orange was tied in ninth with a 99. Haley Newman of Mentor also managed a 99.

Danielle Nicholson of Geneva won the age group with a 75, five strokes ahead of Emily Jereb of Concord.
